The London Group is now accepting entries for its 86th Open exhibition which will take place November at Copeland Gallery, Peckham, London SE15.

Open to UK-based artists over the age of 18 working in all mediums. Deadline: Tuesday 26 August 2025, 12 pm.

The London Group was founded in 1913 and has gone on to successfully nurture the careers of many of Britain's best-known artists.

The exhibition will include up to 200 works by current The London Group members alongside works selected from open submission, at least half the exhibitors will be non-members. Held at one of London's most prestigious contemporary gallery spaces, <u>Copeland Gallery</u>, from Saturday 8 November to Sunday 23 November 2025.

UK-based artists can enter works in any medium including, painting, sculpture, drawing, print, photography, mixed media, installation, video, sound, digital and performance.

The entry fee is £20 for one submission, £35 for two submissions, or £45 for three submissions.

The London Group Open is organised by members on a non-profit basis and all submission fees contribute towards the planning and running of the exhibition.

## Notes to Editors

The London Group was set up in 1913 by thirty-two artists including Walter Sickert, Jacob Epstein, Wyndham Lewis, David Bomberg, Henri Gaudier Brzeska, Sylvia Gosse and Ethel Sands, with the aim of creating a powerful artist-run group to act as a counter-balance to institutions such as the Royal Academy. The founding group created a unique structure for an organisation that has gone on to successfully nurture the careers of many of Britain's best-known artists. Today The London Group is a thriving democratic artists' collective practicing in all disciplines, from painting and sculpture to moving image, digital and performance, with a full annual events programme in London, around the UK and abroad.
